Each phase takes part in a competition where they apply the sport skills that they have developed during the half term (e.g. hockey, athletics, football) in a competition.</p>	£2,040	<p>All children in key stages one and two have taken part in competitive intra-school sport each half term. The competitions have enabled the children to apply the skills taught and practised during the half term.</p>	<p>All classteachers are now able to plan and deliver the half termly competitions without the support of the PE lead. <b>Physical activity at lunchtime</b> Maintenance and repair of fixed playground equipment.	£370 for maintenance £335 for repairs	The playground equipment is kept in good working order so that children have been able to continue to use it to develop gross motor skills.	Olive Hill will continue to fund the maintenance of the equipment from the PE and Sport Premium in 2017-18
<b>Competitive intra and inter school football</b> Fixed goal posts have been purchased to enable the football team to use the school pitch and to enable the children to use the pitch during lunchtimes. Previously mobile goal posts were used, but these could not be used when there was a wind.	£495.60	The school football team has had competitive fixtures with other local schools. Groups of children use the goal posts at lunchtime to play football.	The school caretaker maintains the goal posts.
